## **New Cannabis Regulations**

Recreational cannabis is now legal in British Columbia. As you know from our previous *Legislative Updates* <u>No. 2018-02</u> and <u>No. 2018-03</u>, the BC <u>Cannabis Control and Licensing Act</u> (CCLA) includes significant restrictions aimed at preventing access to cannabis by minors under age 19, <u>including</u> vicarious liability for boards of education and administrators for certain violations of the CCLA.

New regulations set out in the attached *Cannabis Control Regulation* provide further guidance on how the statutory restrictions on recreational cannabis in the CCLA apply to school districts, including:

- Employees or students are exempt from the prohibition on consumption in/on school property if the following conditions are met:
  - The cannabis possessed and consumed is medical cannabis
  - The employee or student carries proof of authority<sup>1</sup> to possess medical cannabis (or in the case of a student, the proof is on file with the school principal, superintendent, or board)
  - The employee or minor student's parent/guardian has notified the school's principal, superintendent, or board of their authority to possess medical cannabis
  - The employee or student's health care practitioner directs consumption of cannabis at intervals which overlap with regular school hours, activities or events
  - The employee or student does not smoke or vape the cannabis.<sup>2</sup>
- Cannabis must not be consumed on or in school property <u>or</u> a sidewalk, boulevard, or similar that abuts school property and a highway (i.e., any road, street, lane, or right of way used or intended for passage of vehicles by the general public).<sup>3</sup>
